“Catholic stuff.” This is what the medical and scientific community says is true.



A Letter from Msgr. Joseph F. Schaedel, V.G.

Dear Parishioners,

We move into weekend number eleven of our cozy crypt church downstairs. Work progresses smoothly upstairs. If you want to “see” what’s happening and what’s proposed to happen, check out our parish Web site: www.holyrosaryindy.org.

This weekend we celebrate the Feast of the **Exaltation of the Holy Cross**. It’s always observed on September 14, which this year happily falls on a Sunday. Today the Church commemorates the redemption of the relic of the Holy Cross on which Our Lord died. It was recaptured by Heraclius, King of Judea, after he defeated Chosroes, King of Persia, who had captured the True Cross six years previously.

It’s probably the opposite today. We spend most of our time trying to avoid the cross, not embrace it. We all have crosses to bear. There is no getting around it. Nobody’s life in this world will be perfect. Our Lord Himself said that those who wish to follow Him must take up their cross and follow. “*We adore You, O Christ, and we praise You! By Your Holy Cross You have redeemed the world!*”

We spend most of our time trying to avoid the cross, not embrace it. We all have crosses to bear. There is no getting around it. Nobody’s life in this world will be perfect.

This Tuesday, September 16, is the annual **Celebrate Life Dinner** sponsored by Indiana Right to Life. It takes place at the Sagamore Ballroom at the Indiana Convention Center beginning at 6 p.m. The speaker this year is Jason S. Jones, co-executive producer of the feature film *Bella*.

Speaking of the convention center downtown, let me also mention the third annual Indiana Catholic Men’s Conference, **Lions Breathing Fire!** It’s Saturday, September 27. Gentlemen, this is an excellent conference for Catholic men. Take a look at the details and register online at www.indianacatholicmen.org. This year’s program particularly lends itself to inviting young men of high school or college age. Check it out.

A recent beloved Italian saint is the popular **Padre Pio**. When one goes shopping for religious articles in Rome, there are pictures and statues of Padre Pio all over the place! The Italians — and most everyone else — love Pa-

dre Pio! We had his statue in the high altar upstairs prior to renovation.

To make a long story short (at least too long for this bulletin column), **Padre Pio** was a Capuchin Franciscan Friar with remarkable spiritual gifts and insights. At the same time, he also had more than his share of crosses to bear. During his lifetime and after his death, Padre Pio was accused of breaking all three of his religious vows: poverty, chastity and obedience.

Yes, this saint was even accused of some of the despicable crimes we read about among clergy today. Saint Pio endured spiritual suffering and even diabolical attacks. Like Saint Francis of Assisi himself, Padre Pio was given the visible stigmata. The stigmata is the visible presence of the five wounds of Christ Himself upon the cross (hands, feet, side).

He was canonized as **Saint Pio of Pietrelcina** by Pope John Paul II in June 2002. His feast day is September 23. This year on that date we observe the fortieth anniversary of Padre Pio’s death. Here at the Italian Parish of Indianapolis we will have a special Mass at 7 p.m. on **Tuesday, September 23**, to commemorate his feast. Mark your calendar.

He basically said that he believes what “his” Church teaches about when life begins (at the moment of conception), but that this is a private matter of personal belief. In other words, he does not think that it’s the job of U.S. government leaders to propagate Catholic beliefs on issues.

Well, Joe, that’s nice. But how about simple Truth? Keep in mind that this concept of human life beginning at conception is not just
