A Letter from Msgr. Joseph F. Schaedel, V.G.

Dear Parishioners,

The month of January is an important time for our government. January is when most elected officials take the oath of office and begin their terms of leadership. We as Catholics have a responsibility to pray for them.

This Wednesday, Jan. 21, will be our new president's first full day in the White House. On Wednesday, afternoon, Holy Rosary will offer a special Holy Hour of Prayer for him and all leaders whose terms begin this month. The Holy Hour will begin at 2 p.m. and conclude at 3 p.m., the Hour of Divine Mercy.

As usual on Wednesdays, the Blessed Sacrament will be exposed for adoration and prayer all afternoon at Holy Rosary from after the noon Mass until the evening Mass at 5:45 p.m. Come; join us in praying the rosary and other special prayers for our government leaders. May God bless America!

We welcome Father David Phillipson back to Holy Rosary. Father Magiera is visiting his mother in Philadelphia for an additional week. He will return on Wednesday. In the meantime, we welcome Father Phillipson!

As I mentioned last week in my bulletin letter,

people have asked me to reprint here what I preached on Gaudete Sunday, the first Sunday we moved back upstairs into our beautifully restored *la Chiesa del Santo Rosario*. Windbag that I am, it's too long for one bulletin. So, here is part one of three:

We are the Chosen People; we have been in exile for nearly sixth months: Masses down in Priori Hall. But it was well worth the wait! Thank you all for your patience, your generosity and your prayers that made all of this beautiful restoration possible.

To be honest, it was a major worry that while we celebrated Masses downstairs attendance would drop. To be perfectly honest, the real worry was that collections would go down. Neither one of them did. Thank you for your faithfulness.

Also, a special thank you goes to all of our parishioners for not kicking the bucket during these last six months. It would have been nearly impossible to conduct a decent funeral downstairs!

A few years ago, a Catholic author named Michael Rose wrote a book. The book is entitled, *Ugly as Sin*. Before you get the notion that the book is about the clergy, listen to its full title: *Ugly as Sin: Why They Changed Our Churches*

from Sacred Places to Meeting Spaces — and How We Can Change Them Back Again.

Mr. Rose wrote about what's happened in many Catholic churches that have been renovated. Michael Rose rightfully makes the point that the way we pray reflects what we believe. In Latin, *lex orandi, lex credendi*: the rule of prayer is the rule of faith.

Naturally, he has his own strong opinions. And he's a talented, clever writer. At the beginning of the book, *Ugly as Sin*, Mr. Rose describes what he calls "*the three natural laws of church architecture*." Let's look at these three "natural laws" in reference to what we have done here at Holy Rosary.

Michael Rose's first "natural law of church architecture" is what he calls verticality. **Verticality** — vertical — up and down. It's the concept that says God is "up there"; we are "down here."

Faith is a journey. Our life in God begins at baptism. That's why we have holy water fonts at the entrance. We entered the Faith Community through baptism; as we enter the church building, we remind ourselves of baptism with holy water.

What's more, we have to be prepared to journey to God. We must repent of our sins. Saint Charles Borromeo is the bishop who more or less "invented" the confessional box or reconciliation room. Saint Charles said if possible, put them in the back. The Sacrament of Penance strengthens us on our journey "up" the aisle to God.

From the beginning, people have always associated God with being "up there." The Ascension of Our Lord into heaven confirms that belief among Christians. And so, a church needs to point heavenward. That's why most church ceilings are high — often vaulted ceilings.

In our church, that's why we uncovered these twenty-one stained glass windows you see in the front here. It's why we uncovered the three skylights over the main altar and the side altars. These windows bring in the light of day, light from above. Verticality is why we enhanced the ceiling throughout the church.

The new electric lights have a practical value; they make the church lighter, brighter. The beams make the ceiling look "richer." **Verticality**. That's why worshipping downstairs for almost six months in Priori Hall was not all that inspiring. Yes, some people thought it was "cozy." It brought us closer together — a community of Faith.

Yet there is more to a church or to worship than community. There's community when Colts fans all sit together at Lucas Oil Stadium. Yet a church building does more than bring us together as community. The church building must point us to God — to heaven.

Back across the choir loft deck we have the sentiments of our founding pastor: *Domus Dei Porta Coeli*. Msgr. Priori wrote in it in Italian: *La Chiesa e il tempio del Signore, la porta del Cielo*. The church is the temple of the Lord; the gate of heaven. And he meant not only Church with a capital "C." Msgr. Priori meant
