## Appunti del Parroco: (From the Pastor's Notebook:)

### A Letter from Msgr. Joseph F. Schaedel, V.G.

Dear Parishioners,

We had a nice crowd Wednesday evening to celebrate the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes and the World Day of Prayer for the Sick. About a dozen people were able to receive the Anointing of the Sick during the liturgy.

As I mentioned last week, the **Knights and Dames of Malta** from the archdiocese participated in the Mass. The Knights and Dames of Malta is a lay religious order. The vast majority of the worldwide membership are married persons with families, regular jobs, etc. They have a particular regimen of spirituality plus a commitment to do what they can to help the poor, the sick and the marginalized.

A similar group is the **Knights and Ladies of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem**. This group has as its particular mission education about and support for the Holy Places. They educate people about conditions and challenges in the Holy Land today. They also provide much-needed financial support for those sacred places and for Christians who continue to live there.

I am very proud that two of our parishioners were recently appointed "section representatives" for the Archdiocese of Indianapolis, the Diocese of Lafayette and the Diocese of

Evansville. They are Sir Mark Ford, KHS, and Lady Marie Ford, KHS. We congratulate Mark and Marie on their new responsibilities. And we thank them. Several other members (including me) are members of the Knights and Ladies of the Holy Sepulchre.

Both groups — Knights and Dames of Malta and the Knights and Ladies of the Holy Sepulchre — have long, proud histories dating back centuries. And from time to time both groups wear their official regalia (capas, hats, medals).

Yes, you might think you stepped into a filming session for *The Da Vinci Code*, but I assure you that both groups are nothing like that!
