what it must have been like; we begin to fathom how Christ willingly suffered for us even though He knew we would let Him down time and time again.

Holy Thursday we celebrated with devotion this gift of Christ’s love — the plan He devised to remain with us always until He comes (again) (Cf. I Corinthians 11:26).

Next Sunday is “**Divine Mercy Sunday.**” A Polish nun, Sister Faustina, inspired the Divine Mercy devotion. Divine Mercy Sunday henceforth is to be celebrated by the Universal Church throughout the world on the Sunday following Easter Sunday. The particular theme of the “Divine Mercy” devotion is God’s endless goodness and mercy as we experience Him in the Eucharist and in the Sacrament of Penance.

The major observance of **Divine Mercy** next Sunday will be at 3 p.m. at Saint Michael Church, 30th Street and Tibbs Avenue. This is the place where the devotion

first began to be observed locally a number of years ago. I will conduct this service. I hope many of you can attend.

Recall that Jesus died on the cross at mid-afternoon, 3 p.m. The Divine Mercy Service is not a Mass. It consists of Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament, the Divine Mercy Chaplet, a sermon and a procession with the Blessed Sacrament much like Holy Thursday’s.

I love this time of year. Happy and Blessed Easter!

A Letter from Msgr. Joseph F. Schaedel, V.G.

Dear Parishioners,

Alleluia! He is risen! *Alleluia!* We've not said that word of rejoicing, *Alleluia*, since Ash Wednesday, Feb. 25 (in the Ordinary Form), or since the Saturday before Septuagesima, Feb. 7 (in the Extraordinary Form). Lent is over.

We celebrate for the next several weeks the greatest of Christian feasts, the Resurrection of Jesus. In fact, Easter is such a major celebration that it lasts fifty days — right up until Pentecost Sunday, May 31.

Welcome to our many visitors this Easter weekend, especially those visiting from out of town. For everyone, keep in mind that we do this every weekend! We have confessions before every Mass every day here at Holy Rosary. Why not approach the Sacrament of Penance so as to be able to receive Holy Communion when you come to Mass?

We welcome Kim Handwerk, Megan Kelly, Kelly Nicholson, Jody Gassert and Ruth Mattingly who joined the Catholic Church during the Easter Vigil ceremonies. We also congratulate Will Kelly (Megan's husband) and Emily Short; they both received the Sacrament

of Confirmation Saturday night.

Here at Holy Rosary we are having a beautiful celebration of Easter. Our Holy Week liturgies are always beautiful. There are so many folks to thank for that. I hesitate to name names. But thanks to Bernie Greene and Sharon Luther, the church is decorated beautifully! We cannot thank you enough. The same goes for our choirs, servers, ushers and everyone else who helped. (*Stewardship in Action!*)

I want to say that I think we had a strong observance of Lent. During the past several weeks, many people have attended daily Mass, the Stations of the Cross, and received the sacrament of Penance here at Holy Rosary. The atten-

dance at the *Quaranta Ore* (Forty Hours) Devotion was outstanding.

Last Saturday night, our parish Knights of Columbus council sponsored a marvelous event. For some reason (I really think I know why) it will stand out in my mind as one of the most meaningful experiences I've had within these four walls.

Our *Santo Rosario* K. of C. held an evening of recollection for members and other men who

wanted to attend. We had more than 45 men here. The first part of the evening was a showing downstairs in Priori Hall of Mel Gibson's famous movie, *The Passion of The Christ*.

If you have seen it, you know how graphic the film is. The cruel violence, the blood shedding, the horror of it is almost too accurately portrayed on the big screen. For most of us, it's hard to watch. Yet it is very moving to imagine how much Christ loved us that He was willing to suffer so horribly.

After the movie, the men moved in silence here into church for Adoration, a fine sermon by Father Magiera, prayers and a chance for confession (about two-thirds of the men went to confession). We began with exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. And, as we gazed at the small, white Host in the monstrance a thought dawned in me: Not to be flippant or disrespectful, but I thought, "Hey, this is the same Guy!"

Present here in the Blessed Sacrament is the very same Person we saw so graphically portrayed a few minutes ago in the movie, *The Passion of The Christ*. That was an actor on the screen; this is the real Person. This is Jesus Christ, true God and true man, Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity present on our altar right before us!

On Holy Thursday, we commemorated the institution of the Holy Eucharist. The movie, *The Passion of The Christ*, opens with the Agony in

the Garden. We heard the story last Sunday, Palm Sunday, as we read the account of the Passion. We pray it as the first sorrowful mystery of the rosary.

It's the scene when Our Lord has left the Last Supper room for the Garden of Olives. Then He asks the disciples to pray with Him. While He is in sheer agony — mental anguish — over what's to come next, Our Lord asks His closest friends to pray with Him. Yet they "*cannot watch one hour*" (Cf. Mark 14:37). They fall asleep.

Every day or night in every Catholic Church, we have the same Christ Who asks us to come to do the same: pray. After Mass Holy Thursday we processed with the Blessed Sacrament downstairs to the repository — a special chapel. We removed the presence of Christ from our altar. We commemorated Our Lord "taken away" by the soldiers.

The repository tabernacle was on the very same stage where we had the movie screen Saturday night. But then it was a film — an actor — portraying Christ's great love for each one of us. Thursday night it was the real Person — the real Savior — on that little stage in a tabernacle.

Adoration of Our Lord continued until midnight. Can we watch one hour with Him? He invites us to receive His true presence in the Eucharist. A film like *The Passion of The Christ* moves us emotionally. We imagine
