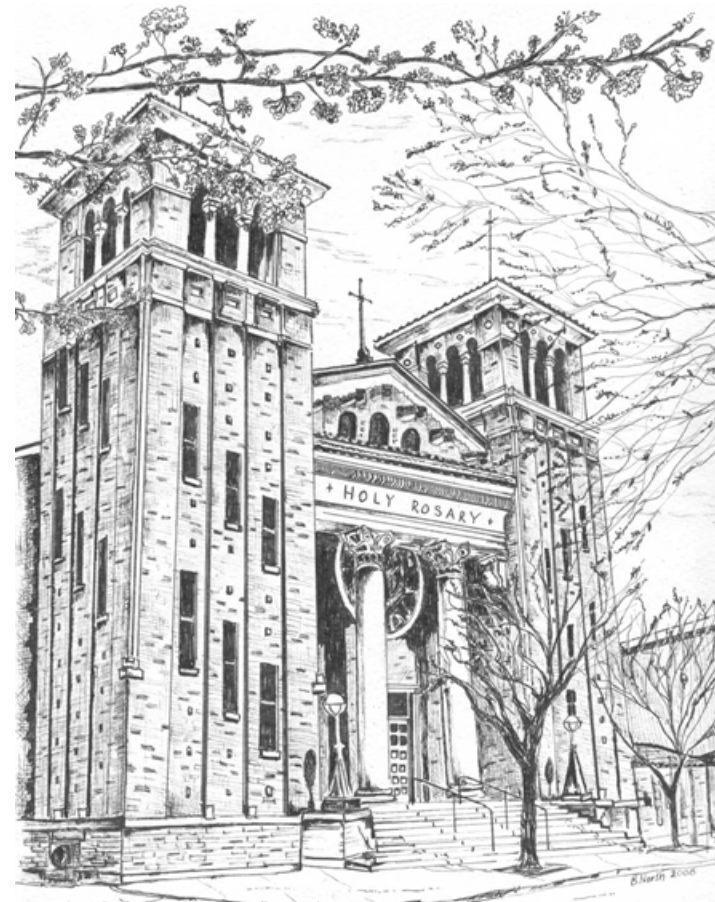

All blood can be precious — donate yours today

The American Red Cross is a primary supplier of blood and blood products for the state of Indiana. While the summer months are a busy time of year for many of us, the Red Cross needs continued support to ensure blood is available for patients in need.

Spending time at the ballpark, going on vacation and enjoying a picnic in the park are activities we associate with the summer. Unfortunately, there is another reality of summer: blood shortages. Currently, 38 percent of the United States population is eligible to donate blood, yet only 8 percent actually do.

The Red Cross is the only blood collection agency that is dedicated to helping families and communities be safer at home and around the world through a broad range of services. It not only supplied area hospitals with blood their patients require, but is also recognized for its valuable contributions certifying people with vital lifesaving skills, mobilizing relief to victims of disasters and serving as a communications link to military personnel.

The goal of the Red Cross is to provide blood to any hospital that requests it. Even when another blood bank supplies a local hospital, the Red Cross can be there during times of shortage or to meet hospital demand for blood or specialized products that other blood banks may be unable to meet.

A single blood donation can be separated into three components: platelets, plasma and red cells.

- Red blood cells are needed by accident victims, surgical patients and people with conditions such as anemia.
- Platelets are primarily used for cancer patients undergoing chemotherapy.
- Plasma is used to treat burn victims and transplant patients.

Since blood can be split into different components, each donation can help save as many as three lives. Just think about the number of lives that could be touched if everyone donated at least once this summer! There are 2,250 hours of summer; the Red Cross — not to mention all those patients who need blood — asks you to spend one of those hours giving the gift of life.

Individuals who are at least 17 years old (16 with parental permission in Indiana), meet weight and height requirements (110 pounds or more, depending on height), and are in generally good health may be eligible to donate blood. By donating blood or recruiting friends, family and neighbors to donate blood, each one of us can play an important role in providing blood whenever and wherever it is needed.

Appunti del Parroco: (From the Pastor's Notebook:)

A Letter from Msgr. Joseph F. Schaedel, V.G.

Dear Parishioners,

This has been a busy, busy week and weekend at Holy Rosary!

Monday through Wednesday evening I led an archdiocesan pilgrimage to the Saint Louis area. We visited the Splendors of the Vatican Art Exhibit at the Saint Louis Museum. It's worth seeing.

We also visited the two cathedral-basilicas in Saint Louis, the Shrine of the Miraculous Medal in Perryville, Mo., the Shrine of Our Lady of the Snows in Belleville, Ill., and the breathtaking Shrine of Saint Joseph in Saint Louis. Any one of them would be well worth a trip.

The folks at the shrines and churches in the Saint Louis area were warm, friendly and gave us marvelous hospitality. Unfortunately, other than that, I found too many folks over there to be arrogant, disorganized and rude. Our thanks go to the Most Reverend Joseph N. Perry, auxiliary bishop of Chicago, for being our celebrant. We also want to thank the other clergy who came to be with this to make this a wonderful occasion. The same goes for Mr. Gary Willen and our altar boys and, of course, our wonderful choir!

Father Magiera is away this weekend. He is in the Boston area to preside at the wedding of our own Dr. Francis Bean. We wish the newly married couple God's blessings! Our guest, Father Mark Drew, will fill in for Father while he is gone for the weekend.

July, the month of the **Precious Blood of Je-**

sus, continues. Just think about it: Jesus gave every single drop of His Precious Blood for love of us — even though He could see into the future and realized how ungrateful and sinful you and I would be. Praised be the Precious Blood of Jesus Christ now and forever!

We will officially begin the program for the **Spiritual Adoption of Priests** early next month. Signups continue after the Masses this weekend and next weekend. Keep in mind that all one needs to do is pledge to pray for a certain priest by name every day. That's all there is to it. You are not expected to do anything beyond spiritual good works. The priest is not informed of the identity of the person(s) praying for him.

If you don't have time to sign up after one of the Masses, just call Lynne at 535-4370. If you have already signed up, please remember to mail the registration card to Opus Sanctorum Angelorum.

We will officially begin this program of prayer on Wednesday, Aug. 4, the **Feast of Saint John Vianney**, patron of parish priests. We will have a prayer service at the beginning of Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament following the noon Mass and repeat it again at the end of Exposition just prior to the 5:45 p.m. Mass that same day. You can participate even if you cannot attend the one of the prayer services.

This month marks my twelfth anniversary as your pastor. I arrived in July 1998. I cannot believe that time has gone so quickly. And together, we have done so much. Thank you for your wonderful support of my pastorate here. I assure you that I am very happy here. Pray for me and know that I pray for all of you every single day.

We are already more than halfway through the month. As painful as it might seem (for the children), it's time to think about beginning school. Most schools open by mid-August. This will be true for Roncalli High School and Central Catholic School. Lumen Christi Catholic School, located here at Holy Rosary, will open a bit later. Are your children or grandchildren registered in a Catholic school or Catholic home school? Parents, there is no substitute!

At the same time, note elsewhere in this bulletin the notice about religious instructions for children who are unable to attend a Catholic school. This is particularly important for first graders preparing for First Confession and First Communion.

As you know, in my role as vicar general I often celebrate Mass places other than Holy Rosary. I offer Mass each day on the pilgrimages — the one last week to Saint Louis and the one this week to the Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe in LaCrosse, Wisconsin.
