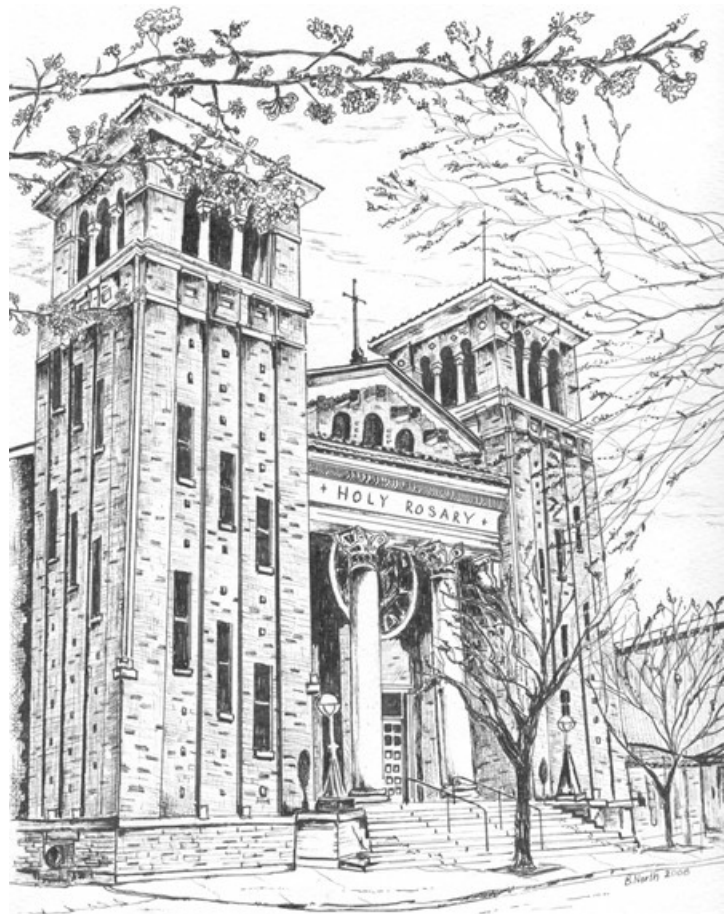

You also have realized that the new translation is far better, and have reacted virtuously — in prudence, justice, obedience and, most of all, in charity — conforming yourself to the will of Almighty God, His Church and the Vicar of Christ.

What an example you are for the rest of the world, my children and my friends.

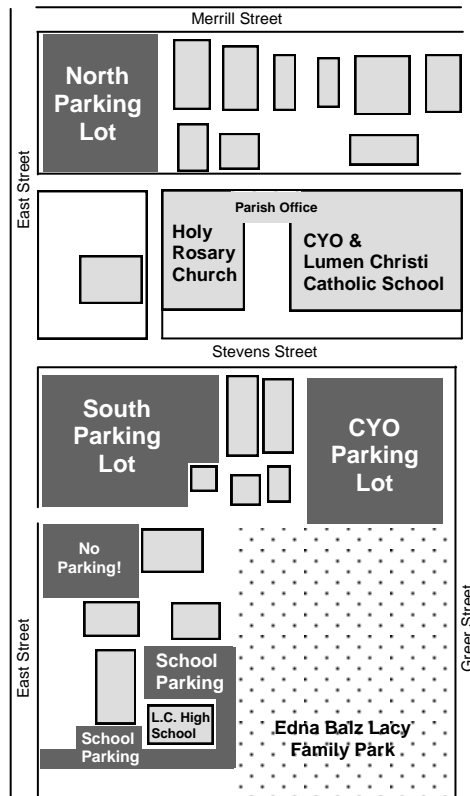

### A Letter from Fr. Michael W. Magiera, administrator

Dear Parishioners,

Well, friends, things have been building up all week, and we soon should have a better idea of what our lives will be like for the next “octave” or so. Funny. In the Church, octaves follow immediately upon a given feast. Yet, for the feast of St. Super Bowl, the octave precedes it. But I’m confident that, with our security measures in place, we will weather the storm.

I must hand it to Father Nagle at St. John Church. He is certainly making the best of a difficult situation. He’s having a “countdown” week with church tours, an “Ask a Catholic” booth and photo opportunities with a life-sized cutout of the Holy Father. Though I’m sure it’s a great inconvenience throughout the year, I’d bet he’s rather happy that St. John was never known for its parking facilities. In this case, no parking is a blessing. The Super Bowl may work out very well for St. John. I truly hope it does. Still, I’m glad we’re here and not there.

While we’re on the subject, I urge you to be prudent in your plans for coming to church next weekend. You may have already experienced some difficulty this weekend. Next weekend, it might be worse. Please use the media and your electronic gadgets to get up-to-the-minute info on traffic and alternate routes.

You know, I really don’t mean to belittle the Super Bowl or to vilify the NFL. Let’s face it, we all have to make a living somehow. Still, I think, as I explained to you last week, I’ve made the correct prudential choices on what

happens at our beautiful Holy Rosary during this time period. I want to assure you again that we will do everything possible to make the next week as painless as we can.

To that end, we’ve engaged a professional firm to administer our parking facilities and we’ve cut back on extraordinary events here at the church. During the upcoming week, the only evening activities we have scheduled are the photo-shoots which finally end Wednesday evening and the two Masses on Wednesday and Friday at 5:45 p.m. On those two evenings, paid parking with Pinnacle Management, the firm we’ve engaged, will begin in our south lot (in front of the church) at 7 p.m.; on all other weekday evenings, it will begin after 4 p.m. Our north lot (behind the church) will be used all day long, every day, for paid parking.

This Saturday and next Saturday, paid parking in the south lot will begin at 6 p.m.; the north lot may not be available for any parking. On both Sundays, both of our lots can be used but only until 2 p.m. Any cars left in our parking lots after 6 p.m. Saturday or 2 p.m. Sunday may be subject to towing.

For the Wednesday photo sessions and for those who regularly park in our lots, like the staff and parishioner neighbors, we will be issuing large parking passes which I have personally signed. These passes will be stamped with the parish seal, and will ensure that those who may or must park in our lots will be able to do so. All others will have to pay the set parking fees or risk towing.

I have had, once, the unpleasant and VERY EXPENSIVE experience of being towed. I also must tell you that I, quite frankly, felt violated. No, having your car towed is not something I recommend.

Though Father Nagle has a bit of an advantage over us with regard to “in your face” evangelization, we do have a definite opportunity to do some evangelization of our own. I know that some of our parishioners are planning to do invitational “blitzes” in area parking lots, to let visitors know Mass times and how beautiful and special this parish of ours is. Each one of us, in addition to being living witnesses to our Catholic Faith, should also be parish advocates, inviting and welcoming one and all to experience the wonderful place known as Holy Rosary.

Last Monday I had the pleasure and honor to concelebrate with Monsignor Schaedel and four other priests at the Mass for Life at the cathedral. I was doubly honored to be able to serve as his deacon for the Mass. Attendance was down from last year. Still, there was a nice showing. Our own Patrick Callahan played the organ and our own Ann Lewis served as hymn leader and cantor. The hymns were wonderful and the Mass ordinary was “The Heritage Mass,” the one we do here as an occasional, suitable alternative to the Latin chant at the Saturday 4:30 and Sunday noon Masses.

As I’ve already mentioned, this Wednesday is the last day scheduled for photos for our upcoming pictorial directory. I am so pleased things have gone well. Frankly, I can’t wait for the finished product. Remember, not only will everyone who is photographed or submits a photo get a directory at no charge, but all will be able to access it online as well. I must make sure that the appropriate link is incorporated into our own website.

Speaking of our website, we’ve embarked on a massive updating project. Not all of the actual text pages have been dealt with but there’s been quite a bit done. Over the last few months, a considerable amount of new stuff has been put on the site as well. Once we get our new directory photos, primarily for groups, of course, there will be a big photo “house cleaning” session undertaken on the website as well.
